

ABOUT THE DREW STREET RAINGARDENS

Strathfield Council won a federally funded grant to build unique gardens in Drew Street. The Drew Street Raingardens in the central median strip, will beautify the street and prevent stormwater pollution from entering nearby Coxs Creek and the Cooks River.

Coxs Creek Bushland Reserve, just behind Drew Street, is one of the few remaining pockets of bushland left in the Municipality and is home to a population of endangered Green and Golden Bell Frogs.

Reducing the amount of stormwater pollution that runs into the area will help the frogs, the creek and the bushland.

Come and help make the new Drew St. raingardens come to life by putting in a native plant or two or just come and have a look and a chat. There will be a free BBQ following the planting.
